MTR Cocktail Reception to Celebrate its 45th Anniversary Committed to Keeping Cities Moving and Continuously Going Beyond Boundaries for Hong Kong

MTR Corporation hosted the 45th Anniversary Cocktail Reception today (28 October 2024) and was joined by distinguished guests to reminiscence on 45 years of growing with Hong Kong through the Corporation's railway operation, railway construction, and community building. Mr John Lee, the Chief Executive of the HKSAR said at the reception, "45 years later, I am proud to call the MTR one of the world's top transit systems. One that delivers reliable, efficient and safe journeys for the people of Hong Kong, and beyond. MTR railway network handles the daily commutes and travelling of more than five million passenger trips in our city. It also connects us to our country, via the Hong Kong Section of the high-speed rail. That strengthens the people-to-people bonds, and business ties, between Hong Kong and many cities across the Mainland. My congratulations, to MTR on your milestone 45th anniversary. I look forward to your continued success in the next 45 years, and more."

Mr John Lee, together with Dr Rex Auyeung, Chairman of MTR Corporation, and Dr Jacob Kam, Chief Executive Officer of MTR Corporation officiated at the toasting ceremony. The three officiating guests jointly initiated a new MTR train front mock-up, with the background immediately displaying how MTR lines are continuing to extend. This symbolises MTR Corporation's commitment to serving Hong Kong and signifies a new milestone in the development of the railway network. Several new railway projects, including the Tung Chung Line Extension, Oyster Bay Station, Kwu Tung Station on the East Rail Line, the Tuen Mun South Extension, and the Hung Shui Kiu Station on the Tuen Ma Line are gradually commencing construction. The railway scheme of the Northern Link has also been gazetted. MTR will invest over HK\$100 billion in new railway projects over the coming years, further expanding the reach of Hong Kong's railway network to benefit passengers and contribute to the long-term economic development of Hong Kong.

"MTR has a unique place in Hong Kong being its mass transit provider and we are proud to be part of the Hong Kong city fabric. Our role goes beyond operating world-class infrastructure, we bring new value to less-developed areas through the addition of railway service and the 'Rail plus Community' integrated development model. MTR's commitment to the railway is long-term and we shall continue to strive our utmost to deliver our mission which is to keep our city moving. We will continue to build for the future by embarking on a series of new railway extensions that will enhance Hong Kong's competitiveness," said Dr Rex Auyeung, Chairman of MTR Corporation.

Over the years, MTR has innovated continually, committed to providing sustainable green and accessible public transportation services that are safe, efficient and reliable, connecting all 18 districts of Hong Kong. In addition, the Guangzhou-Shenzhen-Hong Kong Express Rail Link (Hong Kong Section) seamlessly integrates with the national high-speed rail network, establishing a closer connection that offers greater convenience to people travelling between the mainland and Hong Kong. MTR's expertise and high-level management capabilities have also been recognised externally, expanding its footprint into Mainland China and overseas, keeping Hong Kong and the cities MTR serves moving. In the future, MTR will continue to strive for more successes, creating more new milestones and building a brighter tomorrow, upholding its mission to "Keep Cities Moving".

To celebrate the 45th anniversary, MTR has launched various activities since early this year, allowing the public to reflect on the MTR's growth while engaging with the community. These activities included the "Green T Baby Fun Day", "Station Rail Voyage" exhibition, "Railscape Reminiscence" photography exhibition, the "MTR 45th Anniversary Themed Train", and the "Chill Fun Trainival". The "Belt and Road Railway Forum" and "Ride to Success" Scholarship Programme were organised to foster the development of the railway industry. Additionally, MTR Mobile events including the "Double Rewards Lucky Draw" and "Click & Grab" – giving away 45,000 MTR eCoupons, totalling at HK\$10.5 million, for MTR shopping malls were held to reward passengers.
