## Light Rail Train Captains and MTR Bus Captains Commended for Safe Driving MTR Joins Hands with the Community to Promote Road Safety

The MTR Corporation today (3 December 2024) held a launch event for the "Light Rail & MTR Bus Road Safety and Elderly Travel Safety Campaign" at MTR Tuen Mun Depot. During the event, 144 Light Rail train captains and MTR Bus captains received the "Safe Driving Award" in recognition of their dedication to providing safe and convenient services to the communities. Notably, 27 awardees achieved a continuous 25-year safe driving record.

Since Light Rail and MTR Bus operate on roads shared with other modes of transport, MTR has consistently implemented various measures, including requiring train captains and bus captains to regularly attend refresher courses and self-developing the "Integrated Speed and Position Supervision System" for Light Rail, to enhance our drivers' alertness and help them maintain good driving attitudes. Various Legislative Council members, District Council members, representatives from the New Territories North Region of the Hong Kong Police Force, the Hong Kong Road Safety Patrol, public transport operators and non-governmental organisations attended the launch event today to show their support by joining us to promote road safety.

"Light Rail and MTR Bus have been serving residents in the Northwest New Territories for over 35 years, consistently demonstrating good safety performance. While we will continue to improve our performance, through this year's safety campaign, we also aim to remind passengers, especially the elderly, to be vigilant about road conditions when travelling on the Light Rail and MTR Bus or crossing Light Rail tracks, thereby creating a safe travel environment together," said Ms Jeny Yeung, Managing Director – Hong Kong Transport Services of MTR Corporation.

To enhance the awareness of elderly passenger on travel safety, MTR has established the "Elderly Care Group" and closely cooperates with the Elder Academy and non-governmental organisations to provide safety tips through publicity and educational activities. Additionally, community activities such as visits to Tuen Mun Depot and safety talks are organised to further promote safety messages to the public.
